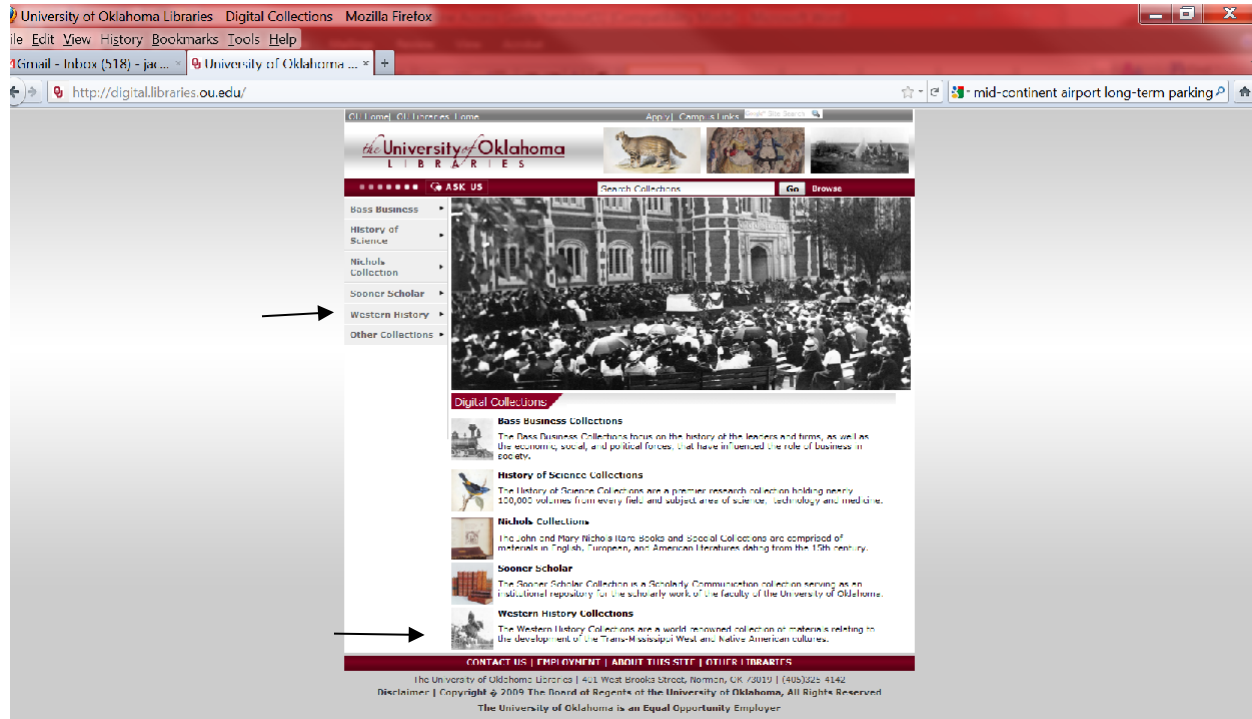
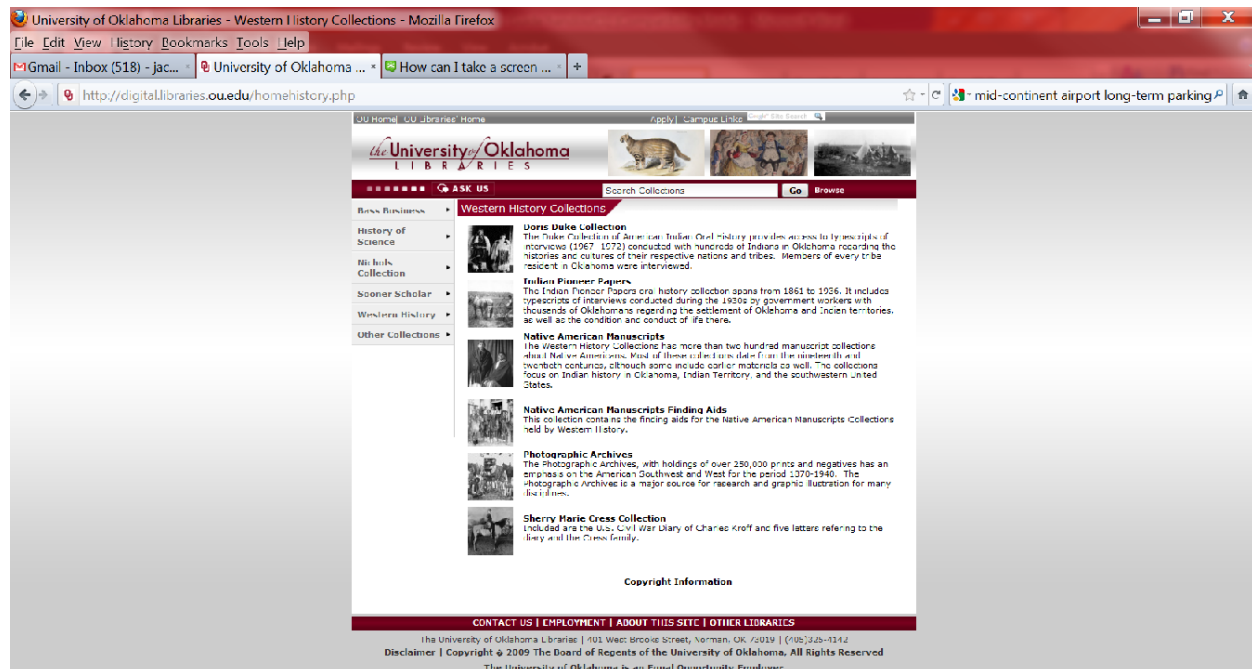


Navigating The Digital Collections

Select “Western History” on the Digital Collections page to access our digital collections. The drop-down menus on the left lists the digital collection areas within Western History.

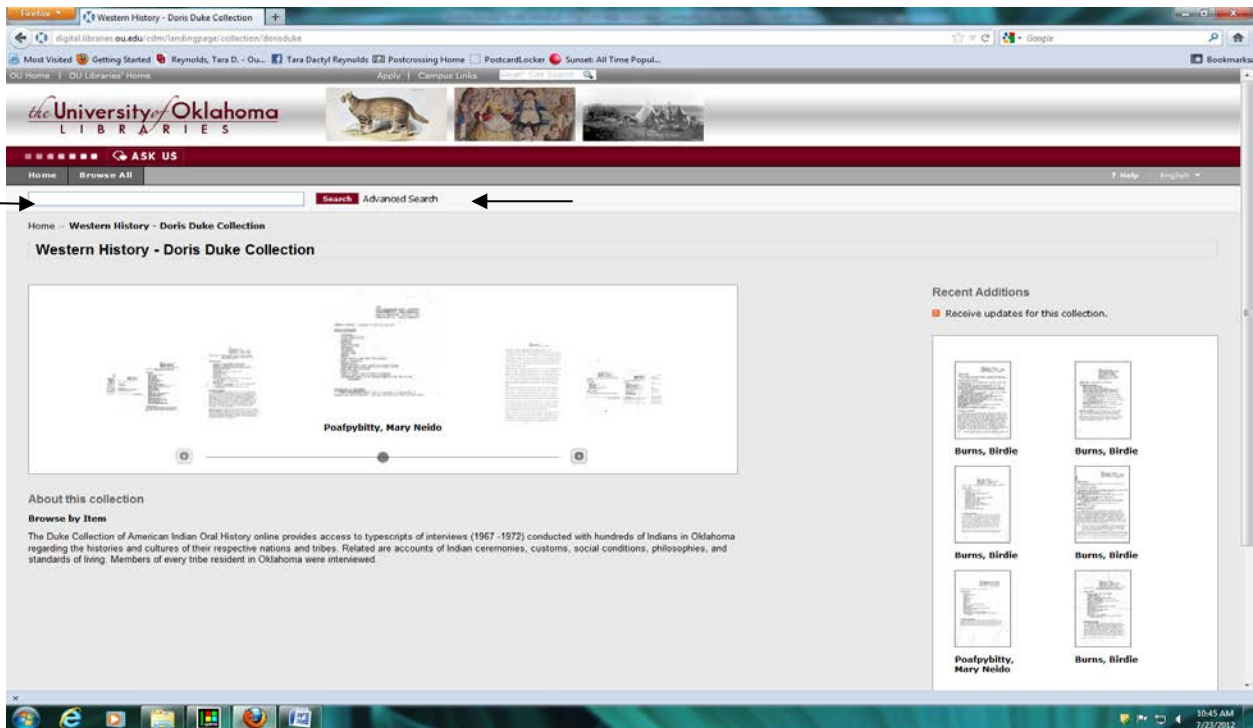


You can find oral history interviews, digitized manuscripts and finding aids through our Digital Collections. These are PDF, downloadable documents. You can access these documents from anywhere.

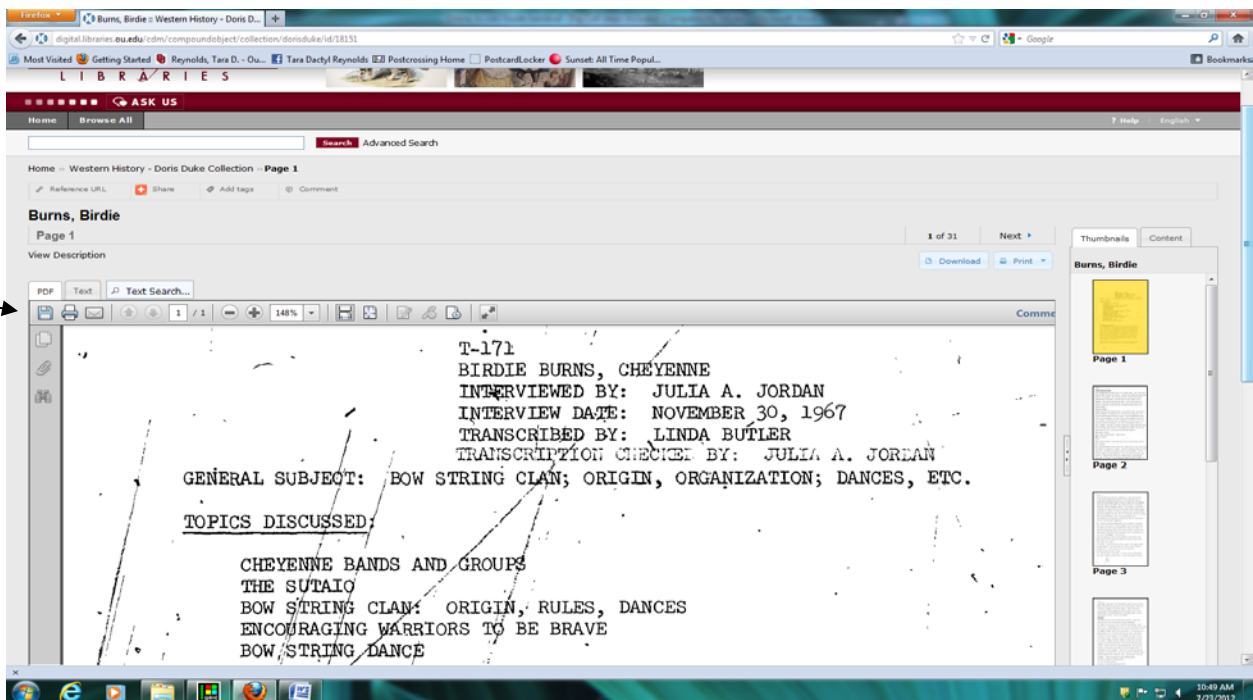


Navigating The Digital Collections

Use the search box on the left side of the screen to search within an individual collection. You may also use the "Advanced Search" function to further narrow results.

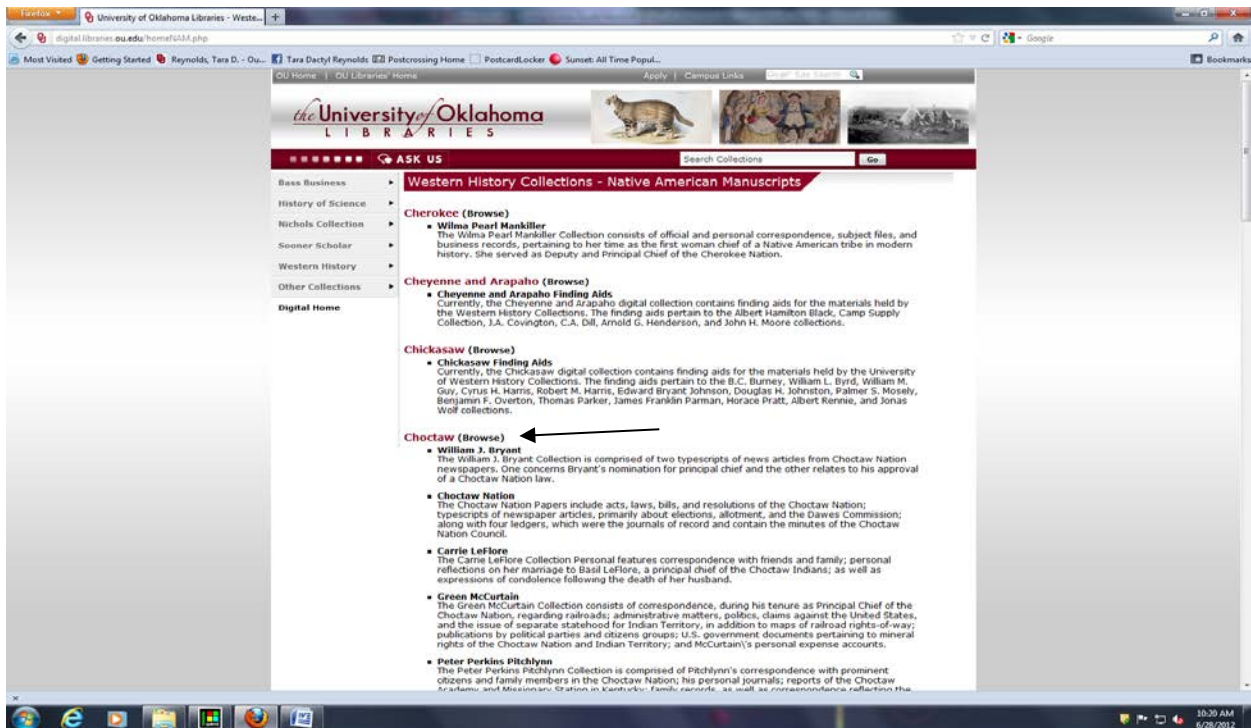


To print or save items in any collection, click on the icons in the upper left of the document view box.

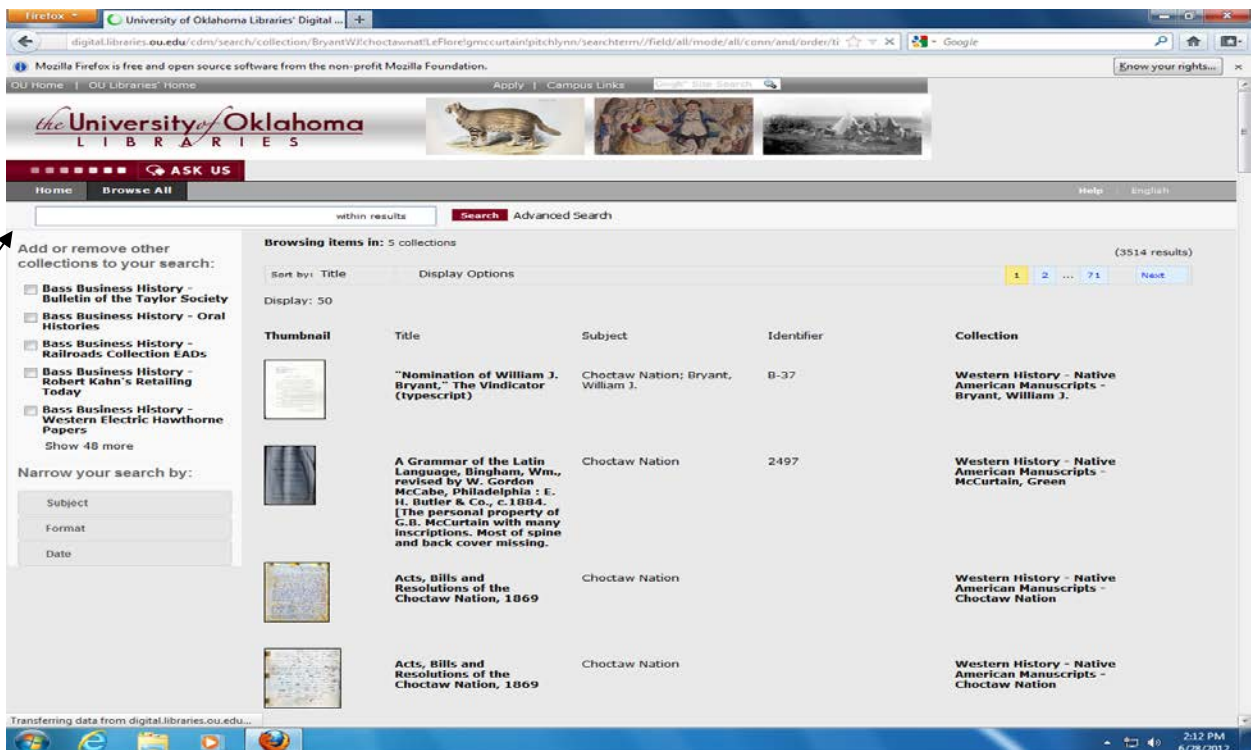


Navigating The Digital Collections

In Native American Manuscripts you can view a collection or browse by tribe. Click on the collection name to view the collection.

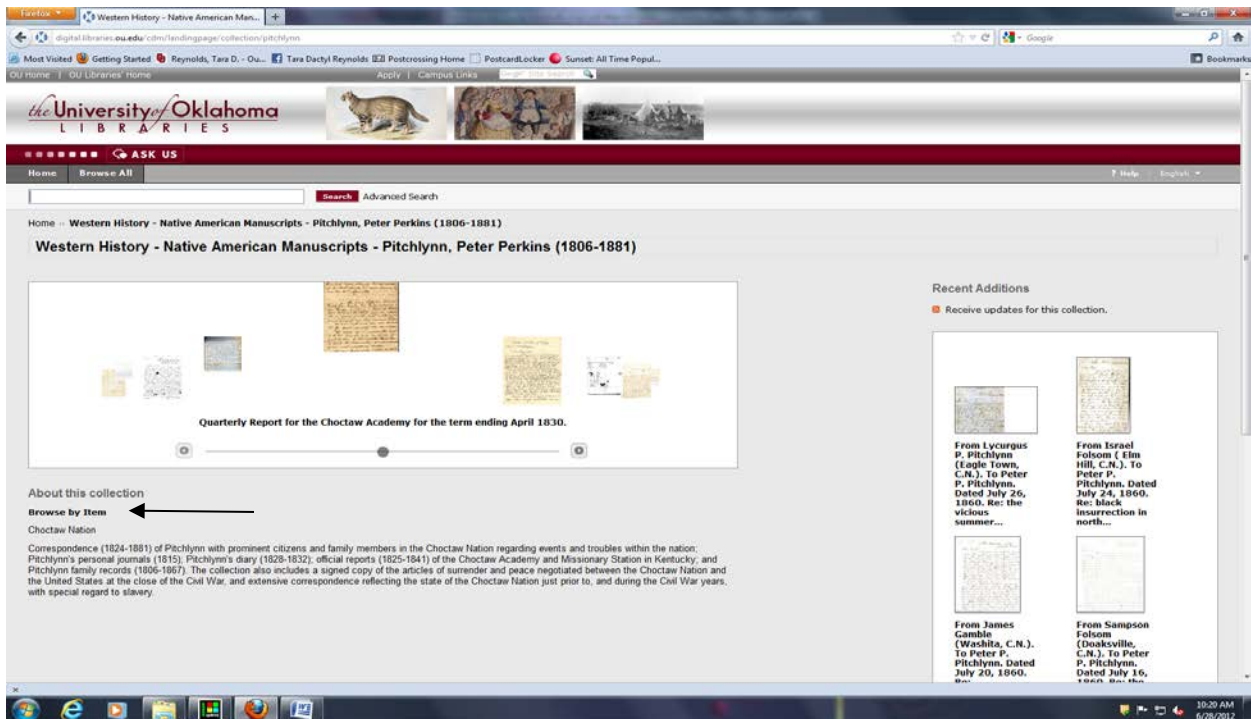


When browsing by tribe, you can search for keywords in the search box near the top left of the page.

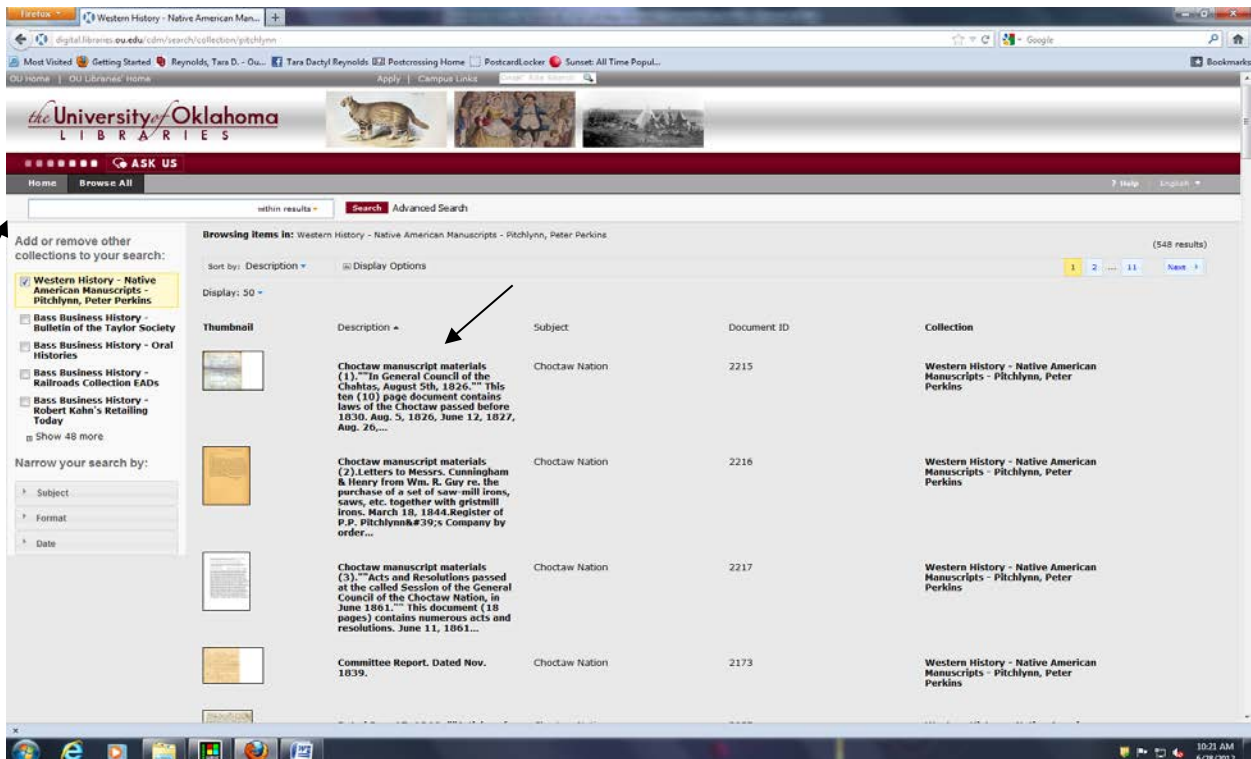


Navigating The Digital Collections

Each collection will have a home page with thumbnail images of documents, a collection description, and a link to browse by item.



When browsing, you may click on the item description to view the item. To search a collection, type your keyword into the search box at the top left.



Navigating The Digital Collections

When viewing an item, the title of the item will be at the top of the screen, the digitized item will be in a scrollable frame within the window, and item citation information will be below the digitized image.
