Abner W. Abrams Collection

Abrams, Abner W. Papers, 1881–1916. .10 foot.

Businessman. Correspondence (1893–1916) concerning lead and zinc mining in Oklahoma, the automotive business in Baxter Springs, Kansas, and real estate holdings, along with a program (1881) of a funeral service for Lucy Grey.
