American Indian chief. Newspaper articles regarding the death of Yuchi chief Sam W. Brown, and the return of the Yuchi Tribe to its ancestral lands in the Chattahoochee Valley, Alabama.

- 1. "Program of the Celebration of the Return of the Yuchi Tribe of Indians to the Chattahoochee Valley, June 7 and 8, 1958".
- 2. "Yuchis Plan Trek to Georgia for Tribal Museum Opening", from an unidentified Tulsa-area newspaper.
- 3. "Georgia Fete to Draw 100 State Yuchis" from an unidentified Tulsa newspaper, regarding the dedication of a museum honoring their tribal culture. See above article also, for more details.
- 4. "Yuchis' Tribal Council Fire to Burn Again" from an unidentified newspaper. This article is about the re-lighting of the Yuchi Indian council fire where it was extinguished more than 125 (in 1958) years ago. Land was also to be returned to the tribe at this time.
- 5. "Euchee Tribe Leader Dies" from the *Tulsa Daily World*, January 1, 1958. An obituary for the late chief, Sam W. Brown.
- 6. "New Yuchi Indian Chieftain visits City for Making Test" from the *Columbus Enquirer*, Columbus, Georgia, April 18, 1958. Chief Samuel H. Brown visited Columbus to see if the people of the area really wanted the center of Yuchi culture returned to the Chattahoochee Valley.
- 7. "Apology", from an unidentified newspaper. This is only a portion of an article. This portion focuses on what was to be done with tribal historical documents and artifacts after the death of Chief Sam W. Brown.
