Christopher James Huggard Collection

Huggard, Christopher James (1962–). Papers, 1987–1989. 3 items.

Historian. Huggard's master's thesis (1987), "The Role of the Family in Settling the Cherokee Outlet," with chapters regarding the land run of 1893, settlement and housing patterns, and interaction with neighbors. Also in this collection is a paper by Huggard later published in the *Chronicles of Oklahoma*, titled "Culture Mixing: Everyday Life Among the Choctaw in the Mid-Nineteenth Century," and a postcard (1989) commemorating the Land Run of 1889.

Folder:

1. Postcard issued by the United States Postal Service in 1989 to commemorate the Land Run of 1889. Bears a Guthrie, Oklahoma "First Day of Issue" cancellation. Also bears a reproduction of color portrait entitled "Settling of Oklahoma" (April 22, 1989).

2. "Culture Mixing: Everyday Life on Missions Among the Choctaw in the Mid-Nineteenth Century" by Christopher J. Huggard, circa 1980s. This essay was later published in 1992 in the *Chronicles of Oklahoma*.
