5. "An act for the relief of and purchase of lands for certain of the Apache Indians of Oklahoma lately confined as Prisoners of War at Fort Sill Military Reservation, and for other purposes." House Resolution 6512, 67th Congress (approved by the House on September 21, 1922). Two photocopies.
6. Letter from William Mimerman, Jr., Assistant Commissioner in the Office of Indian Affairs, to Senator Elmer Thomas re: government policy towards the Fort Sill Apaches (May 21, 1934).
7. Letter from C.F. Hauke, Chief Clerk, to the Secretary of the Interior re: appropriations for allotments for the Fort Sill Apaches (October 31, 1917).
8. Letter from E.B. Meritt, Assistant Commissioner in the Office of Indian Affairs, to J.A. Buntin, Superintendent of the Kiowa Agency, re: payment of ration money to the Fort Sill Apaches who remained in Oklahoma (February 19, 1923).
9. Letter from Glenn L. Emmons, Commissioner of the Bureau of Indians Affairs, to U.S. Representative Toby Morris re: appropriations for allotments to Fort Sill Apaches (July 1, 1960).
