Kennedy, John Fitzgerald (1917–1963). Printed materials, 1963. .33 foot.

Subject collection. Newspapers and news magazines (1963) published in the United States and the Federal Republic of Germany, regarding Kennedy's visit to West Germany and West Berlin in June, 1963, and his assassination in November, 1963. All items in this collection bear cover stories regarding, or are special editions devoted to, President Kennedy and his death.

"The New York Times," November 26, 1963 (international edition -- published at Paris, France).

"New York Herald Tribune," November 26, 1963 (European Edition -- published at Paris, France).

"Newsweek," December 2, 1963 (international edition -- published at Buckinghamshire, Great Britain, United Kingdom).

"Der Spiegel," November 27, 1963 (West German news magazine, published at Hamburg, Federal Republic of Germany).

"The Saturday Evening Post," December 14, 1963 (Memorial edition -- published at New York, New York).

"Life," circa December 1963 (special memorial edition).

"Stern," August 22, 1965 (West Germany news magazine, published at Hamburg, Federal Republic of Germany).

"Quick," June 30, 1963 (West German news magazine, published at Munich, Bavaria, Federal Republic of Germany).

"Quick," November 25, 1963 (West German news magazine, published at Munich, Bavaria, Federal Republic of Germany).

"Berliner Illustrierte," circa July 1963 (West German news magazine. Special edition -- published at Hamburg, Federal Republic of Germany).

"Four Dark Days in History," circa December 1963 (special "collector's copy" edition issued by Special Publications, Inc. -- published at Los Angeles, California).
