**Kinder, George. Printed materials, 1904–1950. 2 items.**

Collector. A booklet (1904–1905) entitled *Souvenir*, listing the teacher and pupils of Mount Pleasant School in Blaine County, Oklahoma Territory; and one entrance ticket to the 1950 Sugar Bowl football game in New Orleans, Louisiana, at which the University of Oklahoma football team won its first national championship.

**Items:**

1. One small booklet entitled, "Souvenir," listing the teachers and pupils of the Mount Pleasant School, 1904-1905, located in Dixon Township, Blaine County, Oklahoma Territory.
  
2. One entrance ticket (1950) to the Sugar Bowl Classic in the Sugar Bowl Stadium, New Orleans, Louisiana. That year's game featured the University of Oklahoma versus Louisiana State University battling for the National Championship. Oklahoma was triumphant, 35-0. This was its first national championship. On the back of the ticket is the printed stipulation, "This ticket is issued for a person of the Caucasian race..."
