- 2. Fort Dodge, Kansas. A 20" x 33" blue on white copy of a plan for the completion of the garrison dated April 15, 1869. Drawer 8606
- 3. Fort Dodge, Kansas. A 25" x 34" copy of a map of the U. S. Military Reservation of Fort Dodge. Surveyed and laid off March, 1868 by 1st Lt. Henry Jackson, 7th U. S. Cavalry; drawn by Alfred S. Page. Attached are a small photocopied plan of Fort Dodge and a small photocopied description of the fort. Map itself is black on white. Drawer 8606

- 37. A 34" x 42" "War Department Map of the Yellowstone and Missouri Rivers and their Tributaries" marking the General Crook Yellowstone Expedition of 1876. Crook's route and battles, waterways, and some topography are shown on this black on white map. An 1876

- 38. Montana and Wyoming. The Cloud Peak, Fort McKinney, and Dayton, Wyoming, the Rosebud, Montana, and the Sheridan, Wyoming-Montana Quadrangles are taped together to form a single 29" x 54" topographic map of the Big Horn Region. Scale 1:125,000. USGS, various years. Drawer 8606
- 39. Two 24" x 31" negative copies stapled together show the Yellowstone and Missouri Rivers and their tributaries as explored in 1859-1860 by Captain Reynolds. War Department, preliminary edition. Drawer 8606
- 40. A 7" x 13" positive copy of a map of Custer's final battle showing his route around the hostile camp and the various Sioux (i.e. Oglala) encampment circles. No date. Drawer 8606
- 41. Big Horn Mountain Range. A 14" x 21" negative copy enlargement from the War Department map of the 1860 expedition of the headwaters of the Yellowstone and Missouri Rivers. Scale 1:600,000. Drawer 8606
- 42. A 10" x 14" negative copy of a map showing the location of the hostile encampment on the fateful day in 1876 when General Custer reached the Little Big Horn. - 43. Great Plans. A 21" x 31" positive copy of a topographical map covering an area from Texas to Canada and showing Indian battles and frontier posts marked in ink and emphasized with red pencil. Towns and state borders are also shown. Post-Oklahoma statehood. Drawer 8606
- 44. Northern Wyoming and southern Montana. An 18" x 22" negative copy of a topographical map showing Yellowstone National Park and the Crow Indian Reservation. From War Department map, 1877. Drawer 8606
- 45. Trans-Mississippi. A 19" x 19" black on white map of the area during the heyday of the Fur Trade, 1807-1843 showing the Oregon and California Trails, Indian tribes, trading posts, and the early line of western defense forts. Drawn by P. Brugholdt; copyrighted by Francis P. Harper, 1901. Drawer 8606
- 46. "Custer's Battle-Field." A 15" x 17" negative copy from the National Archives showing where the officers of the 7th Cavalry fell. Two copies. Surveyed and drawn under the supervision of Lt. Edward Maguire, June 25, 1876. Drawer 8606
- 47. Western Kansas. A 14" x 16" negative copy of a War Department map showing a U. S. Army-Cheyenne conflict on Sept. 27, 1878 as drawn by Captain W. G. Wedemeyer of the 16th Infantry. Two copies. Drawer 8606

- 48. Montana. A 13" x 18" negative copy from the National Archives showing the movement of the Fifth U. S. Infantry against Sitting Bull during the Winter of 1876. Scale 1" = 10 miles. Two copies. U. S. War Department. Drawer 8606
- 49. Two 9" x 14" copies, one positive and one negative, of a map of the June, 1876 battlefield of the Little Big Horn showing the routes and positions of the commands of Reno and Custer, as well as the position of the Indians. Drawer 8606
- 50. Dakota Territory. A two-page 34" x 42" negative National Archives copy showing Fort Philip Kearney and surroundings in 1866. A terrain map produced for the War Department by H. Blarrington of the 18th Infantry. A second negative copy measures 16" x 23". Drawer 8606
- 51. Wyoming. A two-page 16" x 32" negative copy from the National Archives showing the topography of the area of the Military Department of the Platte. Original created under direction of Captain William A. Jones, 1874. Drawer 8606
- 52. Wyoming, Nebraska, and the Dakota Territories. A 32" x 44" negative National Archives copy on four pages. This topographical military map shows the Department of the Platte's scouting parties' lines of march during 1868-1869. Includes drainage information. Drawer 8606
- 53. Northern Plains. An 18" x 50" National Archives copy on four pages showing the line of march followed by General Terry in the 1876 campaign against the Sioux (the route from Fort A Lincoln in Dakota to the Little Big Horn). Scale 1" = 12 miles. U. S. War Department. Drawer 8606
- 54. Yellowstone and Missouri Rivers. Two 34" x 42" copies, one positive and one negative, from the National Archives showing the course of the rivers through the Dakota Territories, Montana, and Wyoming. Scale 1:120,000.
