1. Alaska. A Department of the Interior map compiled by the Office of Indian Affairs in 1937. A blue and white 17" x 24" map showing the locations (in red) of Indian and Eskimo villages, regular settlements, the locations of hospitals, schools, reindeer stations and radios. Drawer 8640
2. Arkansas. By the General Land Office, 1901. A 22" x 28" black and white map, with county lines marked in orange. Railroad routes are shown. (Two copies). Drawer 8597
3. California. By the General Land Office, 1907. Done in two sections, the northern and southern halves of the state make up a 47" x 59" map. Parks, counties, and terrain are shown with the cities and townships. A tri-colored map, with insets of Los Angeles, San Francisco, and San Diego. Drawer 8597
4. California. A National Geographic map, 1954. A colored 27" x 35" map showing cities, roads, parks, and some natural topography. Five insets include Los Angeles, San Francisco, and the Bay area, San Diego, and Yosemite National Park. Drawer 8597

 14. Kentucky. A 1915 Preliminary Map by L. M. Sellier. A black and white 24" x 43" map with counties, towns, rivers and railroads shown. Drawer 8597
 15. Minnesota. Sketch of the Public Surveys in the State of Minnesota. A. J. Bien lithograph from the 39th Congress 1st Session - Annual Report Com. General Land Office. A 20" x 23" black and white map with red, green, and blue lines showing the 6, 15, and 20 mile limits of the Land Grant Railroads. Townships, towns are shown. Northern portions of the state are unsettled. (Torn). Drawer 8597

A large, 30" x 42" bi-colored map showing counties, townships, cities, reservations, National forests, reserves and considerable terrain. Two insets are street guides to Reno and Goldfield. 21. New Mexico. A U.S.G.S. base map with highways and contours, 1957. A toned 47" x 51" map with township lines shown. Drawer 8597
22. New Mexico. An earlier, (1922) U.S.G.S. map. The northern half has been removed. There is considerably less showing than in the previous map. The terrain is quite scanty by comparison. A black and white 25" x 46" map. Drawer 8597
23. New Mexico; A General Land Office Map, 1912. National Forests and Indian Reservations are prevalent on this terrain map. County boundaries and townships are marked. Cities and railroads are shown. Carlsbad Caverns have not yet been discovered. Red and blue pencil markings throughout. A colored 31" x 36" map. Linen backed. Drawer 8597
24. North Dakota. A 1947 pictographic map of the pioneer history of the state. A toned 17" x 27" map. Upper right corner torn away. Drawer 8597
25. Oregon. A General Land Office map, drafted in 1910. A tri-colored 28" x 36" terrain map showing county boundaries, townships, cities, Indian Reservations, National Forests, and railroads. A street guide to Portland is shown in an inset. Drawer 8597
26. South Dakota. A General Land Office map, compiled in 1910. Contains counties, towns, townships, Indian Reservations, National Forests, and railroads. A 23" x 34" tri-colored map. Scale, 1" = 12 miles. Drawer 8597
27. Texas. A pictographic depiction of the literary significance of Texas. Compiled by the Texas and Local History Department of the Dallas Public Library. A yellow 23" x 25" map distributed by the First National Bank in Dallas. (Two copies, dated 1958 and 1955) Drawer 8597
28. Texas. H. H. Colton's 1866 map. A four color 16" x 25" map showing the counties. Four large counties comprise all of west Texas and the panhandle. A railroad from Galveston reaches to Richmond and passed Houston to Cypress Top. Several old roads and trails are named. Three insets depict Sabine Lake, Galveston Bay and the panhandle. (torn) Drawer 8597
29. Texas. A. A. Johnson's 1856 map taken from an atlas. A tri-colored 15" x 19" map quite similar to the previous map, excepting the railroad from Galveston extends to Brenham. The panhandle area or Staked Plain is populated by the "Kioways and Comanches." Galveston Bay is shown in an inset. Drawer 8597
30. Texas. Probably, Bradley's 1895 map. A tri-colored 16" x 22" map. West Texas and the panhandle are considerably changed from the previous maps. Many more counties and towns are now present in those areas. Railroads crisscross the state. Drawer 8640

 101. Colorado Territory. An 1866 Public Survey Map showing the districts in Colorado. Some section and township lines are noted in the Denver and Colorado City regions.
