Frederica S. Dewey Marrs Collection

Marrs, Frederica S. Dewey. Papers, 1861–1912. .33 foot.

Collector. Commissions, orders, and property reports (1881–1906) regarding Frederick Stanley Dewey's service as a contract surgeon and as an assistant surgeon with the U.S. Army in the Philippines; correspondence (1898–1912) regarding a lawsuit over a land claim in Oklahoma Territory; matriculation cards and notices of examination results (1877–1879) from St. Louis (Missouri) Medical College; and a journal (1884), all belonging to Frederick S. Dewey. Also included are commissions, orders, property reports, and discharge papers (1861–1867) regarding George H. Dewey and his service as assistant surgeon with the 11th and 109th Illinois Volunteer Infantry regiments.
