Lillie Kate Miller Collection

Miller, Lillie Kate (b. ca. 1882). Papers, 1900–1904. .33 foot.

Student. Class notebooks (1900–1904) kept by Miller while attending the University of Oklahoma; Miller's diploma (1904) from the University of Oklahoma; and a cookbook (1910) entitled *Home Helps: A Pure Food Cook Book*.
