Leslie P. Ross Collection

Ross, Leslie P., Sr. (1863–1944). Papers, 1892–1944. .50 foot.

Territorial politician and jurist. Correspondence (1892–1916) received by Ross regarding party politics and politicians in Oklahoma Territory and requests for appointment to political offices; a newspaper obituary (1944) of Ross; and a homestead certificate (1902) issued by President Theodore Roosevelt to a pioneer in Oklahoma Territory. A principal correspondent of Ross was William C. Renfrow, and Renfrow's letters comment on his activities before and during his term as governor of Oklahoma Territory.
