Wood recounting her trip from Denver, Colorado, to the border of the Cherokee Outlet in preparation for the 1893 land run; minutes (1912–1921) of the Arthur Foote Music Club at the University of Oklahoma; a roster (1898) of soldiers in Company “M” of the First Volunteer Infantry Regiment of Indian Territory; and a published history (1933) of the Men’s Dinner Club in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.
