Dentist. Manuscripts (n.d.) regarding the history of the Bank of Fairview, Oklahoma, and the arrival of the railroad in that city, along with a savings account record book (1903) from the bank; a letter (1903) regarding the Oklahoma (Territory) Dental Association and the Board of Dental Examiners; a certificate of practice (1903) issued to Walker; and news clippings (1961–1972) regarding the history of the *Fairview Republican* newspaper and of the town of Quapaw, Oklahoma.
