Indian school. Catalogs (1885–1890) of the academy listing trustees, officers, faculty, students, course offerings, and a general history and description of the school; a copy (1884) of “Pages from Cherokee Indian History” by Nevada Couch; and photocopies of documents relating to the founding and operation of the academy. Also included is an issue of the University of Oklahoma’s *Extension Review* devoted to the life and career of Joseph W. Scroggs, the founder of Worcester Academy.
